Pune: Students of standard VIII and IX in city schools can look forward to a lot of fun and excitement with chemistry. A series of 20 chemistry workshops will be held every Saturday between July 2 and December 10 at the National Chemical Laboratory's (NCL) Innovation Park in Pashan.

The workshops, a joint effort of NCL, the Indian institute of science and education and research (IISER) and the exciting science group (ECG), will be held to commemorate the International Year of Chemistry (IYC).
