NCL outreach lecture enthralls students

NATIONAL CHEMICAL LABORATORY'S (NCL) SCHOOL OUTREACH PROGRAMME WAS CONDUCTED AT INNOVATIVE PARK RECENTLY. AROUND 90 STUDENTS OF VARIOUS SECONDARY SCHOOLS ATTENDED THE PROGRAMME. NCL'S CHEMICAL ENGINEERING DIVISION SCIENTIST SANJAY NENE DELIVERED THE SPEECH ON TOPIC 'NEERA, A TRULY INDIGENOUS DRINK'.

Students learnt about various species of Neera. Neera is a non-alcoholic beverage produced by tapping the Palmyra palm (Borrasus flabellifer) and other palms. Neera is collected overnight in earthenware pots from an incision made in the inflorescence axis of the spathe.

Neera is collected the subsequent morning and transported under chilled conditions to local collection centres where it is dispensed to the public as a healthy nutritious drink. It is very popular in Gujarat, Maharashtra, Orissa, West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala and Tamil Nadu. It is documented that the Chola kings fed their
